Once on retreat, I was faced with no cell phone, no emails, no connection to the outside world. I could breathe once again. To me, it was amazing how such simple acts allowed me to rest and enjoy the present moment. The quietness let me focus on all the things I'd been pushing aside and within the silence, acknowledge many of the blessings I just didn't see. I was nourished not only with food and wonderful people around me but also with the opportunity to be in prayer. It wasn't my usual prayer, but it was the conversation that started with "Dear God" and it ended two days later, with a heart of gratitude and my spirit fed.

So, as life continues, the busyness creeps up, but one thing for sure, another retreat is waiting...when I'm ready.

As you may know, journeying in this life isn't just about our daily lives, family, friends, and career, it's also about seeing God's Love among the challenges and sweet moments. I invite you to come on retreat this season. We'd love to see you!






